Matthew 16:1-11, Matthew 28:16-20, Mark 16:9-20



Get Ready!

1. Set aside a specific time and do the lesson along with your child. You may want to do one scene a day spreading them out throughout the week.
2. Make an intentional space. Clear away distractions (other screens, toys, work, etc.). It might be helpful to unfold a blanket on the floor, set up a cushion or special chair. Use the screen for viewing that will hold your child's attention the best.
3. Get some supplies ready for writing, or drawing, maybe a whiteboard or chalkboard, or maybe some figurines, dolls or plush toys to reenact the scene.



Every Scene Has 4 Parts



- Listen: listen and pay attention to the Story



- Remember: tell what you remember or re-tell in your words



- Respond: Answer the questions outloud



- I Wonder: What do you wonder or imagine from the story?

Scene 1: Mary Magdalene Sees Jesus (Mark 16:1-11)

1) Listen to the Story

> Play the video of the scene

2) Remember the Scene

> Ask, “What do you remember from the story?” For older children, ask them to re-tell the story in their own words.

This may seem redundant, but is the most effective way for children to grasp what they have heard and begin to engage the story on their own terms.

3) Respond to the Question:

> Ask the questions giving time for your child to respond or to ask their own questions about things they did not understand

1. What did you learn about the people in this story?

2. What did you learn about Jesus? What did He do or say that surprised you?

3. What do you think God wants us to understand from this story?

The goal is for your child to begin talking and imagining what is happening in the story. Don’t try to impose your views. Make a space for them to begin to imagine.

4) Wonder:

> Ask the “i wonder” questions giving time for your child to respond verbally, or by drawing, or by writing, or acting out the scene.

1. I wonder what it was like walking to Jesus’ grave that Sunday morning?

2. I wonder how Mary felt when she saw that Jesus body was missing?

3. I wonder why Jesus appears to Mary Magdalene?

4. I wonder why Mary Magdalene is no longer afraid to tell others about Jesus.

5. I wonder why Jesus’ friends don’t believe Mary? I wonder how she felt.

The goal is for your child to let their imagination help them “get into” the story. Even if it seems silly, encourage your child in whatever seems to help them engage the story more and ask deeper questions. This is an ongoing process. Help them to have fun as well as learn the story.

Scene 2: Jesus Gives His Friends a “Commission” (Matthew 28:16-20)

1) Listen to the Story

> Play the video of the scene

2) Remember the Scene

> Ask, “What do you remember from the story?” For older children, ask them to re-tell the story in their own words.

This may seem redundant, but is the most effective way for children to grasp what they have heard and begin to engage the story on their own terms.

3) Respond to the Question:

> Ask the questions giving time for your child to respond or to ask their own questions about things they did not understand

1. What did you learn about the Jesus friends and disciples?
2. What did you learn about Jesus? What did He do or say that surprised you?
3. What do you think God wants us to understand from this story?


The goal is for your child to begin talking and imagining what is happening in the story. Don’t try to impose your views. Make a space for them to begin to imagine.

4) Wonder:

> Ask the “i wonder” questions giving time for your child to respond verbally, or by drawing, or by writing, or acting out the scene.

1. I wonder what the disciples were thinking as they walked to the mountain.
2. I wonder how it felt to see Jesus and worship him on the mountain.
3. I wonder why some still doubted that it was Jesus.
4. I wonder what the disciples felt when Jesus asked them to help him with his mission.
5. I wonder how Jesus felt about his friends, the disciples.

The goal is for your child to let their imagination help them “get into” the story. Even if it seems silly, encourage your child in whatever seems to help them engage the story more and ask deeper questions. This is an ongoing process. Help them to have fun as well as learn the story.



the **A-MAZE-ING! RESURRECTION**





EXCERPTS FROM LUKE 24:9-49 NIV

Read the following excerpts as shown (NIV translation), or read from your chosen Bible translation:

EXCERPTS FROM LUKE 24:9-49



⁹ When they came back from the tomb, they told all these things to the Eleven and to all the others.

¹⁰ It was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the others with them who told this to the apostles.

¹¹ But they did not believe the women, because their words seemed to them like nonsense.

¹² Peter, however, got up and ran to the tomb. Bending over, he saw the strips of linen lying by themselves, and he went away, wondering to himself what had happened.

On the Road to Emmaus

¹³ Now that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem.

¹⁴ They were talking with each other about everything that had happened.

¹⁵ As they talked and discussed these things with each other, Jesus himself came up and walked along with them;

¹⁶ but they were kept from recognizing him.

¹⁷ He asked them, "What are you discussing together as you walk along?"

They stood still, their faces downcast.

¹⁸ One of them, named Cleopas, asked him, "Are you the only one visiting Jerusalem who does not know the things that have happened there in these days?"

¹⁹ "What things?" he asked. "About Jesus of Nazareth," they replied. "He was a prophet, powerful in word and deed before God and all the people."

²⁰ The chief priests and our rulers handed him over to be sentenced to death, and they crucified him;

²¹ but we had hoped that he was the one who was going to redeem Israel. And what is more, it is the third day since all this took place.

²² In addition, some of our women amazed us. They went to the tomb early this morning

²³ but didn't find his body. They came and told us that they had seen a vision of angels, who said he was alive.

²⁴ Then some of our companions went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said, but they did not see Jesus."

²⁵ He said to them, "How foolish you are, and how slow to believe all that the prophets have spoken!"

²⁶ Did not the Messiah have to suffer these things and then enter his glory?"

²⁷ And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he explained to them what was said in all the Scriptures concerning himself.



²⁸ As they approached the village to which they were going, Jesus continued on as if he were going farther.

²⁹ But they urged him strongly, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening; the day is almost over." So he went in to stay with them.

³⁰ When he was at the table with them, he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to them.

³¹ Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him, and he disappeared from their sight.

³² They asked each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us?"

³³ They got up and returned at once to Jerusalem. There they found the Eleven and those with them, assembled together

³⁴ and saying, "It is true! The Lord has risen and has appeared to Simon."

³⁵ Then the two told what had happened on the way, and how Jesus was recognized by them when he broke the bread.

Jesus Appears to the Disciples

³⁶ While they were still talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you."

³⁷ They were startled and frightened, thinking they saw a ghost.

³⁸ He said to them, "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts rise in your minds?

³⁹ Look at my hands and my feet. It is I myself! Touch me and see; a ghost does not have flesh and bones, as you see I have."

⁴⁰ When he had said this, he showed them his hands and feet.

⁴¹ And while they still did not believe it because of joy and amazement, he asked them, "Do you have anything here to eat?"

⁴² They gave him a piece of broiled fish,

⁴³ and he took it and ate it in their presence.

⁴⁴ He said to them, "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms."

⁴⁵ Then he opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures.

⁴⁶ He told them, "This is what is written: The Messiah will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day,

⁴⁷ and repentance for the forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem.

⁴⁸ You are witnesses of these things.

⁴⁹ I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high."

MATTHEW 28:16-20 (NIV)

¹⁶ Then the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go.

¹⁷ When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted.

¹⁸ Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.

¹⁹ Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,

²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end."

Questions for Children about the Great Commission:

1. Combining the passages from Luke and Matthew gives us a special opportunity to see the messages together—one of believing Christianity is the Truth and one of seeing the importance of passing God's love on. The passage from Matthew is one of two passages commonly known as “the Great Commission.” What does it tell us to do? **Go and make disciples of all nations.** Some wise Christians have noted that we are God's voice on planet earth right now. If he speaks, he does so through people who are willing to repeat what he has said. What are some things we can do to make sure we hear his voice? **When praying, it is important to listen with your heart. Many people simply speak, and if God has something to share, he doesn't get the chance! Also, God reveals a lot about himself in the Bible. It is important to read with a humble and seeking heart. All the mysterious behaviors come clear, and you can see a loving God with lots of great intentions for man.**

2. The Luke passages are a little spooky. Jesus appears out of nowhere. He eats. He disappears. He appears but people don't recognize him. **What is it all trying to prove? That Jesus really did rise from the dead, and it isn't a hoax.**

3. The women in the opening of Luke 24 had a bad experience with the apostles. What was it? **They told an incredibly moving story, and Jesus' best friends didn't believe them.** Have you ever tried to share why you believe in Jesus, and people either just don't care or think you're stupid? How did it make you feel? How does it help to know that the same thing happened to Jesus' friends, and throughout their lives, to the apostles who came to believe them? **It can make you feel special if you align your problems of doubt with these first believers' problems with doubt.**

TEACHER'S MIGHTY MESSAGE

What about belief in Jesus in the years after the crucifixion? Some people said he died, and that's the end of the story. But other people, special people, saw him alive. A month or so after his murder, 500 people saw him alive near Jerusalem.

Jesus Christ is alive. He's in heaven. And someday he's coming back. Only this time, in a bigger form. Think of a candle. Then think of a ceiling light.

Jesus said in Revelation If we're going to believe in the light of God, we have to believe it in good times and bad. When things get bad, we have to believe he has a bigger plan for us than what we're thinking of. We have to believe he's coming back, and in the meantime, he is with us always. And he wants us to share his love as often as possible.

We need to let his love fill us so we grow in faith, pass on his love, and can be his lamps in a dark world.

- Scissors





PREPARATION:

- 4) Cut out the passport, Bible, and heart and tuck these items inside the mini suitcase



GAME

PASS IT ON

This game will give students a laugh as they try to pass on the love of Christ—with drinking straws! It will take some of the stress off the idea of fulfilling the Great Commission, and give some insight into how much fun it can be to love simply and love well.



MATERIALS:

- Scissors
- Paper
- Straws

OBJECTIVE

Students will compete in pairs to see who can give the most hearts to their friend.

PREPARATION

Cut out a lot of paper hearts using the scissors and paper. The hearts should be about the size of credit card.

INTRODUCTION

In the Great Commission, Jesus told his disciples--and all of us--to pass on his love everywhere we go. Because God's love is unconditional, to imitate him we have to have a lot of patience, a lot of forgiveness, and compassion! Let's try to think of each of the hearts we put across the table as being a measure of grace from God, so that we can feel his love for us and pass it on to our friends!




INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Have students get into pairs.
2. Give each student a handful of paper hearts and a straw.
3. Have them sit across from their partner.
4. When you say “Go!” students will have to pick up a heart by sucking into their straw.
5. They will then place that heart on their partner’s side of the table.
6. They will keep repeating this action until one minute has passed.
7. Students will keep putting hearts on their partner’s side of the table throughout the whole minute.
8. They may ONLY transport them using a straw. At the end of the minute, the student with the smallest number of hearts on their desk wins.



This lesson taught the kids that we have a responsibility to share the love of Christ with many people daily and that we can count on Jesus to always be with us wherever we go.

ALL ABOUT HOPE REFERENCE SHEET

FIRST TIME HOPE APPEARS IN THE BIBLE:

Ruth 1:12: Return home, my daughters; I am too old to have another husband. Even if I thought there was still hope for me—even if I had a husband tonight and then gave birth to sons.

LAST TIME HOPE APPEARS IN THE BIBLE:

1 John 3:3: All who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure.

THREE VERY IMPORTANT OLD TESTAMENT SCRIPTURES ON HOPE:

Jeremiah 29:11: For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.

Psalm 42:11: Why, my soul, are you downcast? Why so disturbed within me? Put your hope in God, for I will yet praise him, my Savior and my God.

Isaiah 40:31: But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint.

THREE VERY IMPORTANT NEW TESTAMENT SCRIPTURES ON HOPE:

Romans 5:5: And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us.

Ephesians 4:4: There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called.

1 Corinthians 2:9: "Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, nor have entered into the heart of man the things which God has prepared for those who love Him."

God's important messages for children on HOPE:

Children can put a great deal of hope in God's help, God's future, God's rescues, etc., but they need to be taught. Once taught, it is great fun to watch them hope, because their imaginations are much stronger than adults', and they have far less difficulty imagining things they are hoping for.

Bible stories showing HOPE:

- Children can put a great deal of hope in God's help, God's future, God's rescues, etc., but they need to In Genesis 6, Noah builds the ark out of hope for his family's future.
- Abraham built two altars based on a promise from God, in Genesis 12:8 and 13:4, because of the hope he had in God's word.
- David gave God his promise to build a temple. Though it was not completed in his lifetime, he had hope in his son Solomon. His prayer is in 2 Samuel 7.
- Some great Psalms of hope include Psalms 30, 31, 39 and 42.
- Pentecost is a great story of hope in the future and hope coming to fruition. Located in Acts 2, it tells of the disciples gaining the great understanding promised to them, but also looking into a future of uncertainty but with the promised hope of the Kingdom of Heaven.



